## Recommendations - Health Focus: Sections C & G

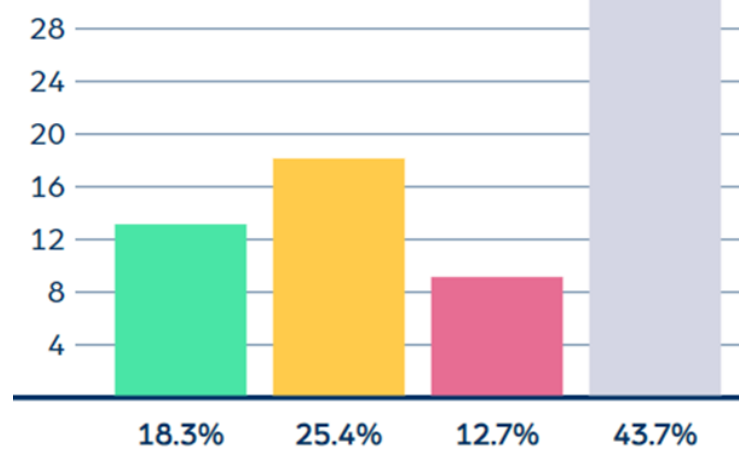
**E.g.**

- To improve grading of section C in EHC Plans, plan writers should explain the health needs and their implications on CYP, instead of just bullet pointing the needs.
- If information is limited, a process should exist to communicate with relevant health service leads for clarification.
- If there are no 'health needs' and section C is not 'applicable', it is crucial to state clearly and comprehensively that there are no health needs. For instance, you could write, "Based on all professional advice considered when drafting this EHCP, NAME has no identified health needs that require exceptional support."

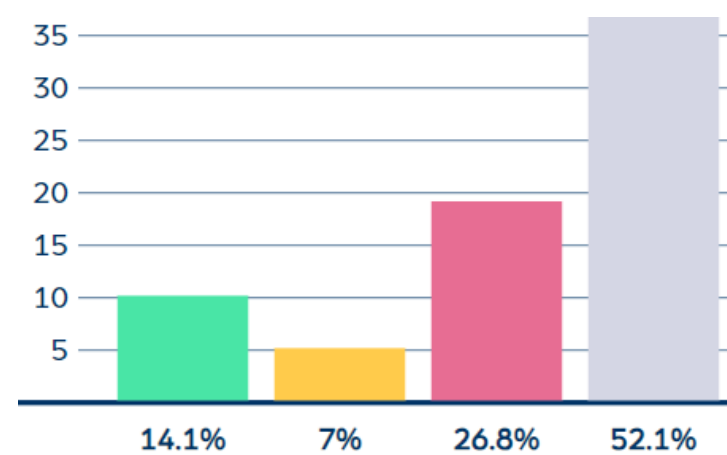

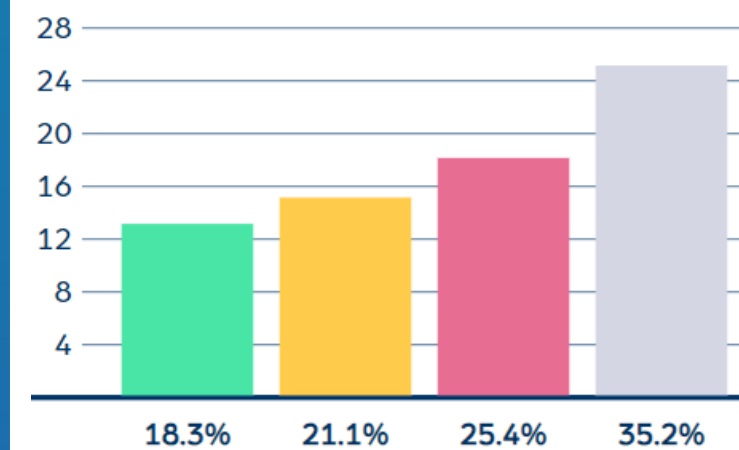

## Recommendations - Social Care Focus: Section D

**E.g.**

- A Designated Social Care Officer (DSCO) can work with relevant service leads to ensure improvements in Sections D, H1 & H2. Find guidance on this role via the link provided here.
- Plan writers should indicate in section D that social care advice was requested, but no social care needs were identified after reviewing the files.
- If section D of a report states that 'social care' needs are not applicable, it is important to clearly state whether or not a child or young person is known to social care. This is because the absence of a social care record does not necessarily mean that there are no social care needs to be addressed.

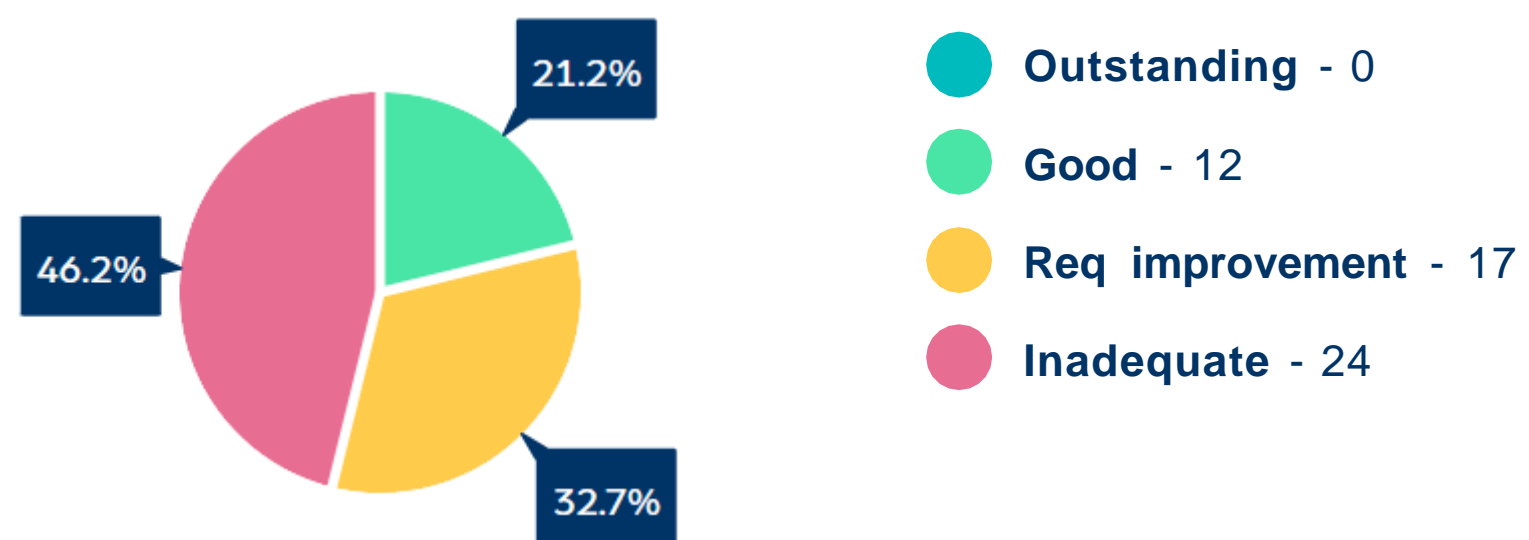




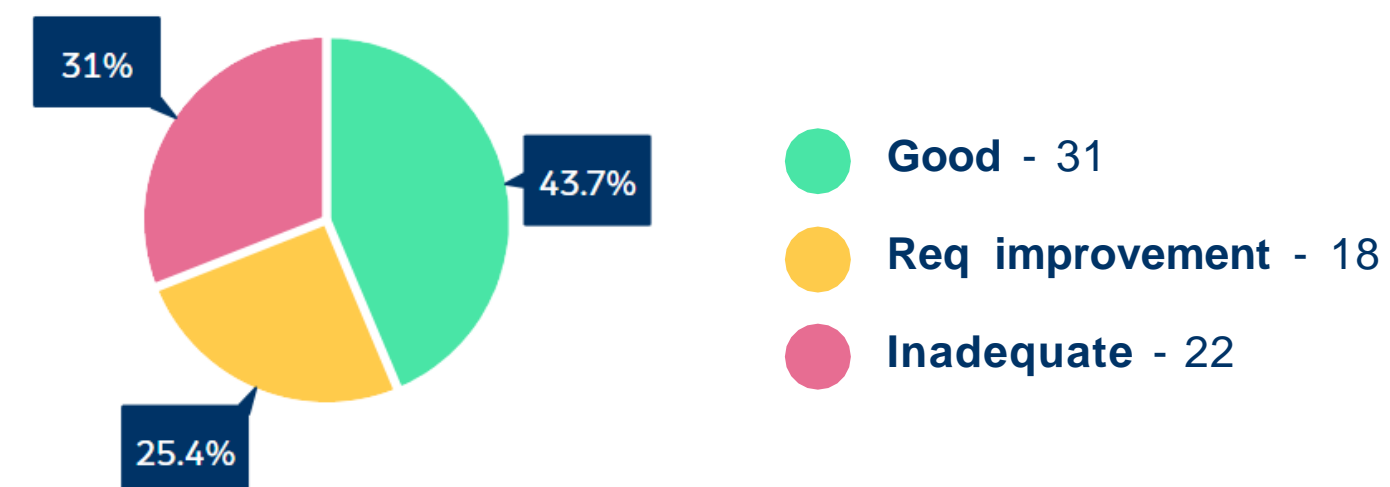

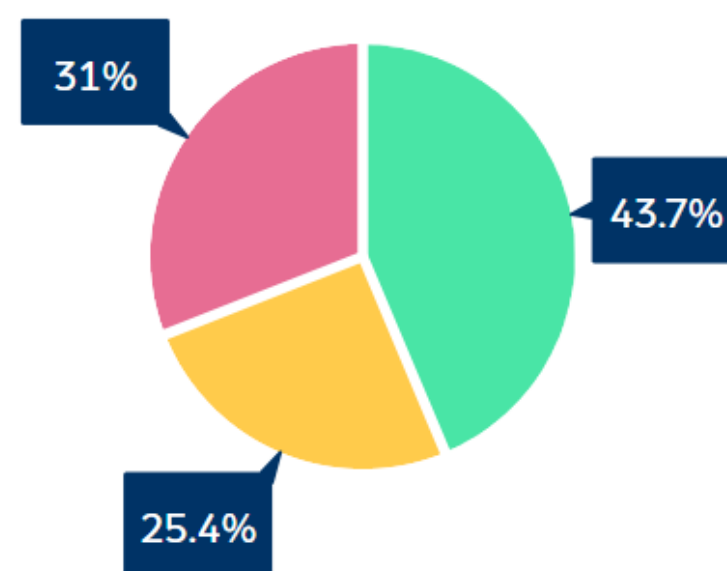

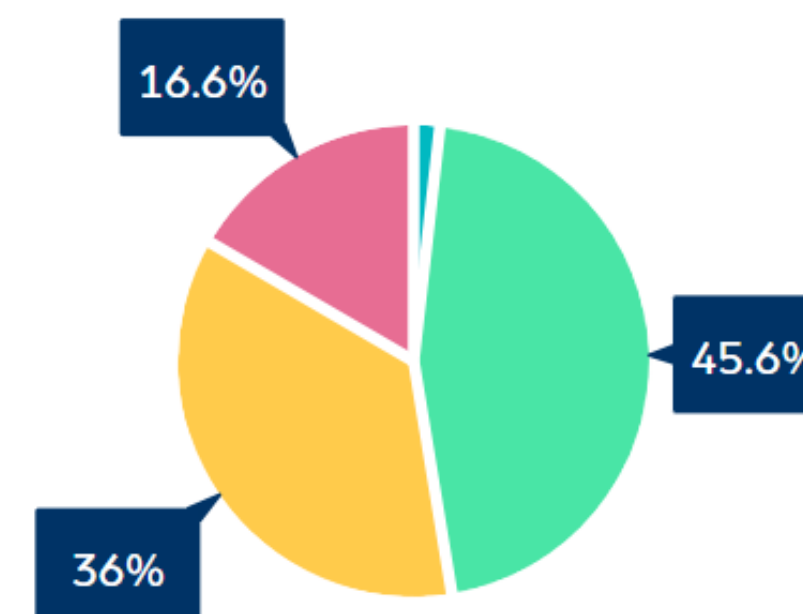

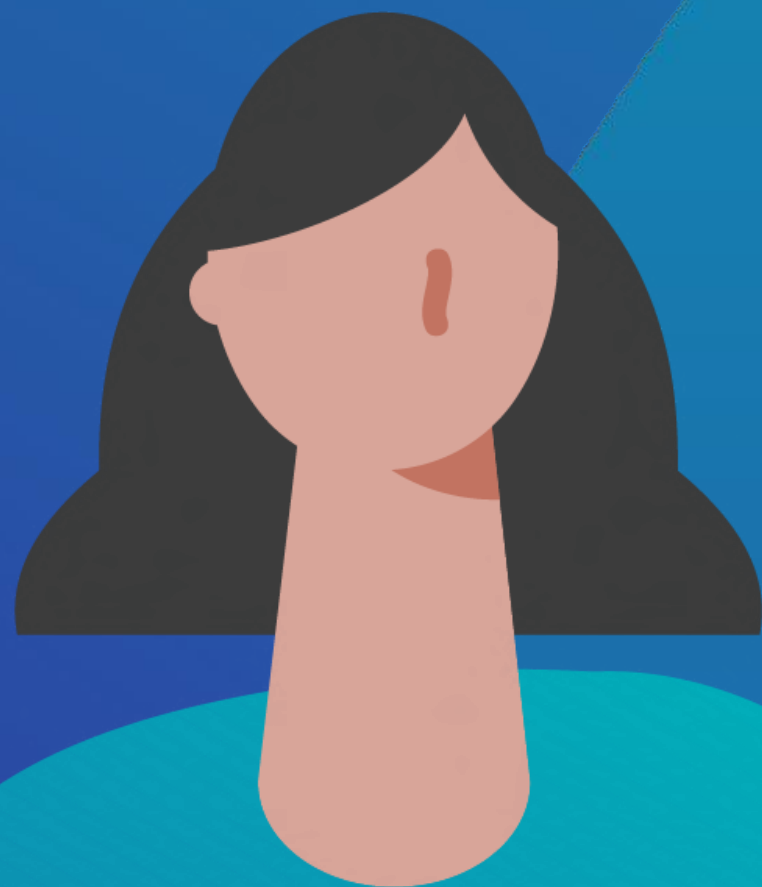
